

Confirmed cases by county



New confirmed cases Cumulative confirmed cases







#### ● Currently hospitalized ● in ICU


#### COVID-19 testing volume in Minnesota

High Risk Housing is <u>not</u> a shelter







### Compare county trends: Confirmed cases & case fatalities




#### Characteristics of cases in Hennepin County

Proportion of confirmed cases by race compared to county population estimates in Hennepin County



Only racial groups with 30 or more cases are included in this analysis. As case are still active, these outcomes should be interpreted as of the last day data were updated and should be expected to change over time. Pending is used to indicate cases that are still being investigated.
