



Current status of high-risk units




Public Health strategy #2: Isolation housing


Temporary housing for people who are experiencing homelessness/staying in congregate shelter settings who have COVID-like symptoms and/or confirmed case of COVID.

People in Isolation Housing are removed from a shelter, have been tested, and need to be isolated until COVID symptoms resolve.



- act as liaison between the county and business community


Members (20-25):

County Involved Youth and Distance Learning

What we've learned

Gaps in technology and access exist for County involved youth.

- Short-term solution is providing hot spots to meet access needs.
 - Broadband connectivity for three apartment complexes in Brooklyn park-there are roughly 64 students between 32 dwellings in 3 apartment complexes
 - Family shelters: Providers have upgraded bandwidth and school districts have provided hot spots.
 - Little Earth-all 212 units have the hookups, but only 10% of residents have internet. MPS has worked to get devices and hot spots to their students.

What we've done

Human Services, Juvenile Probation and be@school coordinated with school districts and community partners to identify targeted areas/youth with device needs and connectivity gaps to problem solve accordingly.

- A combination of foundation funds, child protection flexible spending, and Parent Support Outreach funds have been utilized to purchase 203 devices and funding for hotspots for children in out of home placement.
- Partnership with County IT to address an estimated connectivity gap for approximately 75-100 County involved youth.
- Device and connectivity costs for contracted providers that serve county involved youth and youth served by public assistance programs.

Human Services Waivers

Initiate Waivers

- Waive statutory requirements for face-to-face contact with clients and paper documentation
- Implementation of drop boxes and other non-touch delivery
- MFIP, Cash Assistance, 24-hour requirement on child protection
- Advise DHS and Governor's Office on development of Executive Orders

Extend Waivers

- Comprehensive examination for savings and efficiency
- Legislator engagement

Hennepin Lead and Resources All-County Effort

General Operations Waivers

Elections

- Local option to conduct elections during emergency with new polling places, remote affidavits of candidacy, other temporary measures
- Extends absentee ballot counting period
- Elections Administrator consulted by Secretary of State

Marriage licenses

- County staff initiated interim procedures under emergency authority
- Legislation permitted verification remotely

DEED Waivers

- Comprehensive list of waivers and policy changes for workforce programs
- Agency response is favorable
